



Careseeker (Care Receiver) Responsibilities

Keep Safe Care Direct also recognizes that Careseekers (Care Receivers) have responsibilities, too.

These responsibilities are to:

- Treat your Caregiver with courtesy, respect and without regard to race, color, creed, age, gender, physical disability or national origin
- Provide your Keep Safe Care Direct Caregiver with current, accurate, and timely information regarding your healthcare needs and information regarding a recent fall, hospitalizations, emergency room visits, change in health conditions and change in funding source or location where care is to be provided
- Direct all decisions regarding the development, implementation, and revision or your plan of care (Care Plan)
- Inform Keep Safe Care Direct on a timely basis of any dissatisfaction or question about your Caregiver services or care
- Make prompt payment for services in accordance with your financial responsibility or to inform your Keep Safe Care Direct Caregiver on a timely basis of any difficulty in making payments or need to discontinue future scheduled services.

It is understood and agreed that in instances in which family members participate in the care, assistance or supervision of the Careseeker, they also share the responsibilities described above.
